Appendix I Context on actions to address insensitive conference showcase story

The agenda item on "actions to address insensitive conference showcase story" is about regional teller showcase story at our 2025 conference in Georgia.

One of the women upon whom performance on tales of Southern women was based was a slave. After telling the story of this woman's brave actions—saving her slaveowner—during wartime, in order to emphasize her selflessness of character, added the additional information that, as a slave, she was said to have refused her freedom when it was offered to her, and bequeathed her own seven children as slaves to each of the slaveowner's seven children.

While this may be a historical fact, as storytellers, we must be mindful about how we wield historical fact. The major issue was that in the context of the ending of story, the addition of this information made story seem to portray this refusal of freedom and perpetuation of slavery in a positive light.

Many attendees were—understandably—very angry about this, and one or two asked us to make a public apology or retraction. Sue O'Halloran—our opening teller of the conference, who is very well-known as a speaker on diversity—had a one-on-one conversation with after the showcase explaining why her story was problematic and hurt many in the audience. apologized profusely, and it was clear intention was not to be hurtful. Sue was optimistic that expressed would take much deeper care in content moving forward.

I wanted to update the board that this issue seems resolved—Leslie has spoken to many of the attendees who reached out about story and they largely think this one-on-one conversation with was an appropriate response. They are no longer pressing us for a public retraction or apology.

I want to emphasize we have apologized individually to each attendee who has raised this, but given that it is now clear this was not an intentional comment on slavery on part, and that has expressed sincere regret, we feel it would be unnecessarily cruel to publicly denounce. In keeping with this, at the board meeting, I will address this issue without mentioning name, instead only referring to as "the regional teller." I ask you to also please refrain from using name during the board meeting.

To prevent this from happening at future showcases, during the board meeting, I wanted to discuss the extent to which we should vet showcase tellers for potentially problematic content.

This year, each regional teller did submit a 300-word summary (albeit not a script) of their story, but I think it would have been hard to anticipate this issue arising from the application alone. It is a well-known teller (Storytelling Network president, former NSN board member, performer at Jonesborough in the past); Submitted summary was detailed, focusing on inclusivity and empowerment of Southern women; and this problematic part of story was not mentioned in the summary, likely because it wasn't part of the actual story, but an auxiliary detail mentioned afterward.

It might not be feasible to ask for a video or script of the story at the application phase, but perhaps we need language to ask tellers to be aware of avoiding controversial or insensitive material? I know The Moth does this and we may find other organizations that have something drafted already. I would like to put together an ad hoc committee to examine this.
