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

# NATIONAL STORYTELLING NETWORK ELECTS NEW BOARD TO OVERSEE TRANSITION

As you may have heard, NSN is undergoing a transition from being regional to being focused to SIGs (Special Interest Groups). This will mean that much programming will originate in the SIGs and the NSN core organization will focus on coordination and the overall administrative operation of our mission. The final actions of NSN's board as a regional organization were to meet on March 25 and accomplish the following.

The National Storytelling Network formed a new SIG, Environmental Storytelling, led by Fran Stalling and Linda Yemoto. The board re-elected seven board members who chose to continue to serve to the new board: Kory May, Gary Kuntz, Delanna Reed, Debra Olson-Tolar, Trudy Hanson, Linda Marchisio and Sara DeBeer.

Each SIG elected representatives to the board. Producers & Organizers (PRO SIG) elected Lisa Overholser. Youth Educators & Storytellers (YES SIG) elected Angela Lloyd. Storytelling in Organizations (SIO SIG) elected Sara Armstrong and Environmental Storytelling (ECO SIG) elected Linda Yemoto.

The new board elected its officers for the next year, serving a term from Apr 1, 2023 to Dec 31, 2023. Trudy Hanson will be Chair of the Network, Delanna Reed will be Vice-Chair and will succeed Ms. Hanson as Chair next year. The Vice Chair-elect, whose term as Chair will begin two years after their election, will be nominated from the membership and elected by all members. Finally, Margaret Read MacDonald was elected Secretary.

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» Also discussed was the financial model going forward since in the past the SIGs operated as mostly independent organizations with their own funding. The handling of the SIG funds already earned was discussed too. These issues were tabled until the SIG boards can individually discuss their ideas. The board heard comments from nonprofit consultant Zoot Velasco, who has been very successful in fundraising for similar organizations. The board gleaned several ideas from him and will be investigating taking his advice on a number of them.

As you might recall, NSN membership will now come with the benefit of membership in the SIG of one's choice. Once the website is changed to implement this, registering for NSN membership will cost \$50 with membership in additional SIGS costing \$25 each. For those of you who feel that none of the existing four SIGs address your interests in storytelling, we encourage you to do what Fran and Linda did – put the word out that you would like to start a new group. The current bylaws call for a proposal to the board and interest from at least 20 members. If you can't recruit 20 members, you can form a discussion group while you grow. The transition team would like to expand the number of groups to meet the needs of diverse NSN member interests. You can post on the Storytell list on our Facebook page or we can send out mailings for you. The next board meeting will be on April 22 via Zoom. As always, you are welcome to join. The link will be posted on the website under events. And if you're not an NSN member, check us out. Anyone interested in storytelling should find plenty of interest. And if you're interested in helping us, look for opportunities to volunteer in the coming days. We are quite confident that you will see a "rebirth" of NSN among the rumors of its demise. We are working hard to fix broken things and to implement the new. And... we are always looking for feedback.

# VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR NEW BOARD POSITIONS AND COMMITTEES

The NSN Transition Team has helped put together the foundation for our newly reconstructed NSN Board. There are three appointed positions that we need to fill. A brief description of each is provided below. If you have a particular expertise or interest and would like to serve, please send a brief summary of your experience to <a href="mailto:hansontrudy@outlook.com">hansontrudy@outlook.com</a>. Each of these board positions would serve for a term of one year. (Because of term limitations in the first year of our restructured board, that actually means a term from April 1 to Dec. 31, 2023).

**Digital/Technical Specialist** – This appointed board member would assist with digital/technical duties for the organization. This may include, but is not limited to: assisting with Zoom meetings, Zoom conferences, web-page updates.

**Publications Manager** – The Publications Manager will oversee all digital or print publications created by the National Storytelling Network. This may include, but is not limited to, producing a regular member newsletter.

**Volunteer Coordinator** – The Volunteer Coordinator will work with NSN volunteers to manage organizational initiatives. For example, the Volunteer Coordinator could assist with assigning volunteers to help with both online or inperson conferences.

Under our restructured organization, we have the following committees which need to be appointed. If you have a particular expertise or interest in serving on one of these committees, please also send a brief summary of your experience. The terms of committee members will be staggered, meaning that if a committee has three members, then one of those will serve for a one year term; one of those will serve for a two year term, and one of those will serve for a three year term. »



- » Finance Committee The Finance Committee shall be composed of at least two Members of the Board of Directors. The Chairperson of the committee shall be the Finance Chair of the Board. The committee shall have such responsibilities as are assigned to it by the Board of Directors.
- Nominating Committee The Nominating Committee shall be composed of at least one member of the Board of Directors and four NSN members. The committee shall be in charge of developing a list of nominations for the Executive Committee.
- Oracle Awards Committee The Oracle Awards Committee shall be composed of at least three NSN members charged with reviewing nominations and choosing award winners annually.
- Grants Committee The Grants Committee shall be composed of at least three NSN members and is charged with reviewing, awarding grants, and overseeing the Sponsored Member Program.
- By-Laws Committee The By-Laws Committee shall be composed of at least three NSN members and is charged with reviewing the By-Laws annually and recommending amendments to be considered at the annual NSN meeting.
- Fundraising Committee The Fundraising Committee is composed of one NSN Board member and two NSN members and is charged with designing fundraising efforts.
- Membership Committee The Membership Committee is composed of one NSN Board member and two NSN members and is charged with recruiting new members. Several creative ideas have been presented about creating more awareness of NSN, such as a "Benefit of the Month" feature to be included in the NSN newsletter or perhaps brief video clips in which members mention how NSN has helped them develop as a storyteller.
- Events Committee The Events Committee is composed of one NSN Board
  member and two NSN members and is charged with proposing and planning
  events sponsored by NSN. (These events are in addition to the programming
  coordinated by the Vice Chair of the Board and the SIG Representatives.) For
  example, the Events Committee might organize a storytelling workshop of
  interest to the general public or schedule an information session about
  managing social media outlets.

The work of these committees will be overseen by the person elected as the Vice-Chair Elect. The Vice-Chair Elect and the Chair of the NSN Board will confer about board meeting agendas and notify committees when reports are scheduled to be given.


# LETTER OF APPRECIATION TO NSN GENERAL MEMBERSHIP

The NSN Transition Team thanks each member of the National Storytelling Network for their support of the restructuring of NSN. As stated on the NSN website, our vision is to create:

A world in which all people value the power of storytelling and its ability to connect, inspire, and instill respect within our hearts and communities.

We invite you to join us in creating that vision with the restructuring of the National Storytelling Network. As approved by the membership in February, the NSN board has transitioned from representation through geographical regions to a structure that is driven by storytelling interest groups.



We appreciate all of the suggestions and comments that have been taken into consideration in the restructuring and look forward to serving the membership and creating storytelling connections among tellers, no matter their geographical location. One of the comments that we received during the deliberation was the desire to return to the former name National Association for the Preservation and Perpetuation of Storytelling. While we are not returning to that name, we do recognize the importance of what NAPPS stood for – both preserving and perpetuating the love of story. »



- » One way to help us accomplish the preservation and perpetuation of storytelling is forming new storytelling interest groups. The following interest groups have been suggested in conversations we have had with members:
- Traditional Storytelling (including folk and fairy tales)
- Personal Narrative
- Digital Storytelling
- Epic Tales
- State/Regional Storytelling Associations
- Sacred Storytelling
- Historical Storytelling
- Tales of Diversity
- Storytelling and Song
- Professional Storytellers

According to our newly approved Bylaws, the threshold for creating a Special Interest Group has been lowered to 20 members. Also, as approved by the former board, NSN membership includes membership in ONE special interest group, at no additional cost. Members can also opt to join more than one SIG for an additional charge of \$25.

Additionally, the restructuring created clearly stated responsibilities for the Executive Leadership Committee. The NSN Board Chair has overall oversight for at-large directors, committees and SIGS. The NSN Vice Chair is charged with coordinating programing for the association with the assistance of SIG leaders. The Vice Chair Elect is responsible for directing the work of all standing committees. New appointed positions include that of Digital/Technical Specialist, Publications Manager and Volunteer Coordinator.

We welcome all members to join us in creating a world where all people value the power of storytelling in its many forms and genres. Taking liberties with song lyrics (of Hal David and Burt Bacharach) what the world needs now is stories—story in all its simplicity and complexity—that speaks to our hearts and communities.
