DEBRA OLSON-TOLAR AND GARY KUNTZ COMPLETE BOARD TERMS

On behalf of the National Storytelling Network Board, I want to thank at-large NSN Board members Debra Olson-Tolar and Gary Kuntz for their long-time service to storytelling and especially to the National Storytelling Network. Both of these dedicated members completed their terms of service at the end of December, 2023.



Debra Olson-Tolar was born in Chicago and raised in Colorado. She earned a Ph.D. in Speech Communication at the University of Denver before moving to California. After many years of teaching storytelling, public speaking, screenwriting, and other communication courses, Debra quit her "day job" to follow her bliss and become a full-time actor and storyteller.

Debra starred in the award-winning indie feature Half Way, and has appeared in a number of short films, including leads in Cause for Divorce and One in Eight. Her television appearances include the Lifetime movie Adopting Terror and the Comedy Central shows Key and Peele and Tosh.O. Stage performances include Amanda in The Glass Menagerie, Bridgette in Mourning Song, and her solo show, Raising My Voice. Her numerous performances as a storyteller have included venues such as The Getty and The Los Angeles Storytelling Festival. Debra most recently served as an atlarge member of the NSN Board after the restructuring of the board to reflect a SIG-Centric leadership model. She served as a member of the Membership Committee and the ad hoc committee to select scholarship winners for the first Kathryn Tucker Windham Scholarship.





Gary Kuntz is a member of River and Prairie Storyweavers, based out of Kansas City, MO, and can be regularly heard at RAPS meetings and storyslams. He is the 2013 Kansas Storytelling Festival Tall Tales Champion. He has previously performed for the Heart of America Shakespeare Festival's Green Show (30 minutes with audience participation) for shows such as Julius Caesar and Romeo & Juliet. Gary's NSN Board service included serving as secretary of the board. He also provided assistance to NSN when NSN equipment and materials had to be moved out of the office location at the Woodneath Library Center in Kansas City and into a storage unit and continues to assist with handling these items.
